
## Wild reindeer and caribou on the Arctic islands

#### Svalbard reindeer (Not At Risk)

- Annual population counts in three areas on Spitsbergen, but lack of data for other areas/islands including Edgeøya Island
- No predators; non-migratory; 60% glaciated, inhabit all non-glaciated areas including isolated peninsulas, lowland valleys

## Novaya Zemlya Archipelago Two populations including the unique R.t. pearsoni (Recovered/Rare) & wild reindeer which

genetically incorporate a historic introduction of domesticated reindeer

Lists of a list 20 000 soils

Historically, 20,000 wild reindeer
Currently (2015) estimated 5,000

#### **Franz Josef Land**

· Little known wild reindeer

#### Severnaya Zemlya

1000-1,500 wild reindeer

#### **New Siberian Islands**

- Currently, I–I,500 wild reindeer
- · Historically, large changes in numbers


#### Wrangel Island

· No wild reindeer; currently 300 feral domesticated reindeer

#### **SUMMARY**

- The Arctic Basin is huge (8M km²) & has 6 archipelagos + coastal islands: Svalbard 61,022 km²; Russia 144,000 km²; Canada 780,000 km²
- Diverse as three endemic sub-species (R.t. platyrhynchus . R.t. pearyi and R.t. pearsoni): either non-migratory or migratory including interislands/mainland over sea-ice
- Russia and Canada report long-term declines in abundance.
- Marked differences in degree of annual monitoring and hence high degree of uncertainty (except for some areas in Svalbard)


Severe and strongly seasonal climate that is rapidly changing



# Canadian Arctic Islands (excluding Baffin Island)

#### Peary caribou (Threatened)

- Periodic winter die-offs on western islands
- Limited or no recovery on southern islands
- Overall 35% decline 1987–2015
- Current (2014) estimate 13,700 caribou
- · Hunting on eastern & southern islands
- · Wolves present on most islands



### Dolphin & Union caribou (Endangered)

- Only occurs on Victoria Island
- Migrates across sea ice to winter on mainland
- 47% decline between 1997 and 2015
- Current estimate 18,400 (2015)
