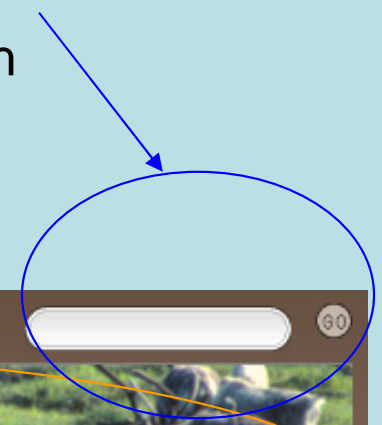

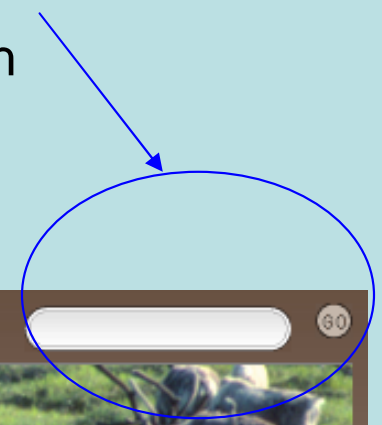

- Search attachments (pdf's, excel files, word documents)
- Appropriate to user ids (e.g. steering committee docs if you are signed in)
- Available to public

# How to contribute?
